Organization

Purpose

This handbook is to give guests of the DCYO FREE 2020 Fall Play-a-thon information about the organization, its policies, and its expectations.

Non-Discrimination Policy

DCYO gives equal membership and employment, contracting, and volunteer opportunities to all individuals, regardless of race, color, religion, marital status, national origin, military status, gender, sexual orientation, gender expression, citizenship, disability, or geographic location. Because we are a youth orchestra membership is open to individuals only through the age of 21.

Tuition

DCYO 2020 FALL Play-a-Thon is free

Financial assistance

Financial assistance, based on need, is available through DCYO Financial Assistance Program for those who apply. This program is designed to help students with financial need participate in DCYO. Our desire is to provide tuition assistance, and in some cases, make an instrument available. Any student 17 years old or younger are eligible who meet the requirements for free or reduced lunch at school. Students who are in financial need, but who do not meet this lunch program qualification may still qualify, based on need. Please include the student's name, the school musician attends, and if there is a Free and Reduced Lunch Program being used and/or an explanation for assistance. Expectations

COVID 19 - Protocol

Due to the current pandemic in the World, United States, and Colorado, DCYO requires musicians and family attending DCYO Fall 2020 Play-a-thon to follow the following protocol:

- Sign a COVID 19 waiver and return to DCYO by November 4, 2020
- Complete application and medical form and return by November 4, 2020
- Temperature check - musician - prior to entrance to DCYO Fall 2020 Play-a-thon
- Family will be asked to wait outside Play-a-Thon area
- Washing/Sanitizing of hands on arrival to Play-a-Thon area
- Wearing a mask at all times before, during and after Play-a-Thon
- No food to be brought to Play-a-Thon area
- Bring a water bottle with water to Play-a-Thon

DCYO will make the final determination for anyone's admittance to the Play-a-thon on any given day.

Behavior

- All musicians will treat each other with respect and dignity, and will contribute to a positive and encouraging atmosphere.
- Musicians will arrive with: mask, instrument, pencil, music stand and water bottle.
- All musicians may arrive 15 minutes prior to Play-a-Thon start time.
- Downbeat is 10:00 am which means arrival at 9:45 is welcome
- Musicians' focus must be on the conductor during Play-a-Thon; no excessive talking or disruptive behavior. Musicians are NOT permitted to chew gum, eat, or drink (other than water) during Play-a-Thon. **All cell phones must be turned off during Play-a-Thon.**
- Musicians are a guest of New Hope Presbyterian Church and DCYO. Please remain in the Play-a-Thon space. All other areas are off limits. It is important to be very respectful of New Hope Presbyterian Church.
- Due to COVID19 - snacks will not be provided
- Safety is always a priority, therefore, please do not leave the Play-a-thon space during any breaks or any other time until Play-a-Thon is concluded.

Musicians and Family and DCYO

Musicians:

Attendance and Preparation

- Musicians must sign in and out before and after each Play-a-thon
- Musicians are encouraged to have two years of playing experience prior to attending Play-a-thon

Family:

Attendance and Preparation

- All paperwork MUST be received by November 4 to be admitted either Nov. 7 or 14
- Parents, please walk your student musician to the Play-a-thon sign-in area.
- Musicians please bring: Mask, instrument, pencil, music stand, water bottle
- Covid 19 protocol will be followed.
- Student musicians will sign the attendance sheet themselves.
- Remember, safety is important and no musician will leave unless an adult is accompanying them.
- Arrive 15 minutes prior to Play-a-thon for COVID 19 protocol and sign in.
- Only musicians will be able to enter the facility. Parents and family will wait outside or return at noon.

DCYO:

Covid19 preparation

- DCYO staff will be wearing masks at all times
- DCYO will prepare the Play-a-thon area with sanitization of all chairs.
- Distancing of all musicians will be provided and ensured
- No snacks will be served
- Hand sanitizer will be made available in the Play-a-thon space
